<p>The main purpose of the present course is to grasp the main features of what would be the “International Judicial Function” at the international level and to what extent it protects the general interests of the international community. Since international courts and tribunals perform different functions within the international community, the main idea is to conduct a perusal on the law governing such judicial bodies, examine some procedural issues relevant to their current function and, to the extent that it is possible, understand the influence they have in the law making processes in certain fields of International Law. This examination will be conducted in parallel with a deeper understanding of current problems of the international legal order.</p> <p>The topic covered in this discipline shall be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The law governing international adjudication: jurisdiction, consent and beyond. • The relevant case law of the main inter-State international tribunals. • General principles of procedure and recent problems faced by adjudicative bodies. • Recent practice of international courts and tribunals. • The influence of the case law of international courts and tribunals in the law-making processes.
